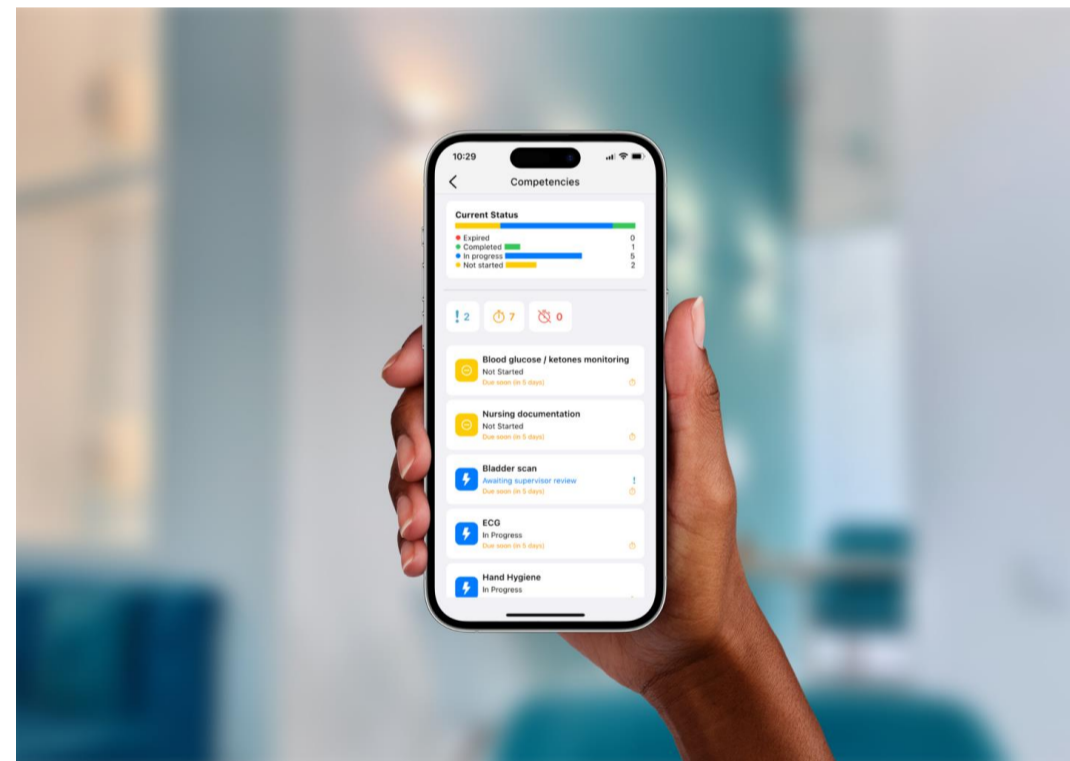


PROBLEM

Clinical competencies are the specific skills needed every day in patient care. Most healthcare professionals will use some form of competency in their practice, and most patients staying in hospital will require them. However, almost everything about learning, assessing and revalidating these skills is managed on paper. Inconsistent and repeated paper competency assessments are demoralising for staff, limit professional development, and may ultimately lead to poor retention.

Gaps and unwarranted variance in competence can put patient safety at risk and leave management in the dark on the skills and potential of their workforce.

SUCCESSES AND IMPACT

- Through a ground-breaking collaboration, the UKONS System Anti-Cancer Therapy Competency Passport (used by the majority of NHS and private chemotherapy nurses) is being developed to launch across the whole of the UK on Compassly in 2023.
- Based on clinical user feedback, the team built and launched v2.0 of Compassly, with the features their users were most passionate about – renewal and expiry, deadlines and reminders and beautiful PDF digital competency certificates.
- They are now planning their first NHS group model implementation, to bring consistent digital competency assessments and seamless passporting of skills across multiple NHS Trusts in a group.
